The Fair Housing Enforcement Program of Legal Aid Society of Hawai'i is dedicated to ensuring that all persons are afforded equal access to housing, furthering the goal of equal opportunity housing and providing assistance in the enforcement of fair housing law.

State law prohibits housing discrimination based on race, color, religion, national origin, religion, gender identity or expression, family status, disability, marital status, age, sexual orientation and HIV infection.

What is Testing?

Testing is a type of investigation that is used to uncover illegal housing discrimination. Testing is a controlled method to measure and document differences in the treatment of home seekers by housing providers.

What is a Tester?

A tester is someone who poses as a potential home buyer or renter. Testers go on an assignment, interact with the housing provider, and objectively report their experiences to the Investigation Coordinator.

Why Test?

Testing allows us to identify and investigate instances of illegal housing discrimination. The U.S. Supreme court recognizes the importance and legitimacy of testing as a necessary method of uncovering and detecting housing discrimination.
