

### **Island Map Indicating All Acquisition Recommendations**

# General Observations


- In this region, there is a lack of public access to mauka areas, with the exception of hunting access and Kokee
- There is a relative lack of public shoreline parks. Salt Pond Beach Park is the only major shoreline park between Poipu Beach Park and Polihale State Park, a distance of over 30 miles of coastline
- The few existing public shoreline rights-of-way appear to be encroached by adjacent private developments
- There is no system of shoreline trails or interconnected access-ways

# More General Observations

- Coastal areas are under development pressure, as is the case around most of Kauai, with open space and naturalized areas being converted to residential, multi-family, and visitor rentals
- While large-lot agricultural subdivisions are not currently as dominant here as in other regions, they have the potential to restrict or block traditional public access
- Residents have expressed the need to maintain certain areas in their existing state with no additional development or accommodation of increased use

Hanapepe Valley Overlook on Kaunualii Highway is a scenic overlook maintained by the State Dept. of Transportation. The scenic views from the overlook at middle ground and background are intact (northern valley wall and mauka valleys).

# Hanapepe Valley




The view of the valley bottom is currently obscured by overgrown brush and trees.



Vehicular traffic is heavy in the paved pull-off area and can exceed the capacity for parked cars. The adjacent overflow parking area is not designed for scenic views. Pedestrian access between the overflow parking area and scenic overlook is narrow and is located close to main highway traffic causing concern for pedestrian safety.





This is a rural agricultural area, with active agriculture. Scenic values include red valley walls, and a setting where agriculture in small farms and a naturalized setting predominate. There is hiking potential, however there are concerns that public access and associated publicity will interfere with existing agricultural operations.

## **Hanapepe Valley (east road)**

This undeveloped area on the west bank of Waimea River, near the highway, was cleared of trash by the County (at the community's request). The area was currently being used as vessel parking by a commercial tour boat operation.

## Waimea River

This second ditch area has a grassy lawn with small pavilions near the lifeguard tower. Larger pavilions may be needed. This is the only public beach park from Salt Pond Beach Park to Polihale State Park. The existing portable toilets could be relocated to avoid obstructing views of Niihau.



There are narrow unpaved accesses from Kaumualii Highway that appear threatened. There is a need to check the legal status of these access-ways to ensure that they are recorded. Perhaps 'public access' signage is required. Recommendations for acquisition was received to consider the Knudsen parcel in Kekaha and access and parking through Faye's former dairy area.

## **Public Shoreline Access- ways in Kekaha-Waimea from Kaumualii Highway**








This is an area with multiple resources--natural, cultural, recreational--and multiple uses. This is a significant area for the public. There are concerns about adverse impacts to ongoing traditional salt-making activities, including problems associated with the existing roadway through Salt Pond. There is the potential for better management of the entire Puolo Point area through comprehensive planning and coordinated preservation efforts.


## **Puolo Point Area (Salt Pond Beach park, Hanapepe Salt Pans, Burns Field Area)**

This is the only major beach park from Poipu Beach Park to Polihale State Park. The park is at capacity on some weekends and holidays. The existing camping area is adjacent to the salt ponds. There is the potential for expansion of Salt Pond Beach Park westward and mauka of the existing park.

# Salt Pond Beach Park









Expanded use of the sandy beach by vehicles and unregulated camping were observed. There are concerns about increased adverse impacts, including impacts on water quality caused by the runway/airfield and the unregulated public use in open land makai of the runway and near the salt pans.



There is potential for a coastal trail system along the shoreline from Salt Pond Beach Park through harbor lands or adjacent lands and extending eastward.

## **Port Allen Small Boat Harbor**


This is part of an historical trail system to Mt. Kahili. There is potential loss of public access from Kaunualii Highway due to a new gated agricultural subdivision, destruction of an old public access, and construction and maintenance of a newer road on private land. There is a need to definitively determine the status of the public access-way. There is potential for priority acquisition of expanded access and/or restoration of public access.


# Alexander Reservoir and Access from Kaunualii Highway













There is potential for more access to mauka areas for hiking, hunting, horseback riding, and other activities with coordinated scheduling. Motorcycles would likely be incompatible.











This historical fishpond is now overgrown with invasive vegetation on the fishpond walls and there is heavy siltation in the pond. There is potential for acquisition and restoration. This site has cultural values, scenic and open space values.

## About the Open Space Program

Kauai's Open Space Program was established in an effort to protect and preserve the places Kauai's people hold dear. A small portion of the island's property taxes were set aside in a special fund, an advisory commission was established, and the program was staffed. Now after a few years of appropriations, the "Open Space Fund" is over 1.2 million dollars and growing.

Program staff and members of the Public Access, Open Space, and Natural Resources Preservation Fund Commission seek public input each year in order to establish priorities for use of the Open Space Fund. These recommendations are then transmitted to the County Council and Mayor for their consideration.

This year, we will hold six public meetings around Kauai to present background information about the program and seek public input. We will also launch an online survey to gather public input, but equivalent paper survey forms will be available to people who prefer them.

# Kaua'i Open Space Program – 2007 Public Input Process

## Public Meetings

Each year, the County of Kauai Planning Department and the Open Space Commission ask Kauai residents for their input in setting priorities for public access, open space, and natural resource preservation on Kauai. Several public meetings are held around the island to provide a forum for this process.

In July, 2007, six public meetings will be held around Kauai—in Koloa, Lihue, Hanalei, Waimea, Kapaa, and Kilauea. The meetings will present background information on the County's Open Space Program, give meeting participants an opportunity to interact with members of the Open Space Commission, and introduce this year's public input survey.

## Public Input Survey

On July 16, 2007, the Open Space Program will launch the County of Kauai 2007 Public Access / Open Space Survey. It will be conducted primarily as an online, internet-based survey at:

For people who prefer them, an equivalent paper version of the survey will be available at the public meetings, by download from the web site, or from the Planning Department.



## Open Space Program Background

On November 5, 2002, Kauai voters approved an amendment to the County Charter that established the "Public Access, Open Space, Natural Resources Preservation Fund" and stipulated that each year a minimum of one half of one percent of the County's certified real property taxes would be deposited into the fund.

The charter amendment further specified that the fund would be used to acquire lands or property entitlements for the following purposes:

1. Public outdoor recreation and education, including access to beaches and mountains;
2. Preservation of historic or culturally important land areas and sites;
3. Protection of significant habitats or ecosystems, including buffer zones;
4. Preserving forests, beaches, coastal areas, and agricultural lands;
5. Protecting watershed lands to preserve water quality and water supply;
6. Conserving land in order to reduce erosion, floods, landslides, and runoff;
7. Improving disabled and public access to, and enjoyment of, public land and open space; and
8. Acquiring disabled and public access to public land and open space.

On December 15, 2003, as the charter amendment directed, the County Council enacted Ordinance 812 to establish procedures for the administration and priorities for the expenditure of the fund. The ordinance also established a nine-member advisory commission, the "Public Access, Open Space, and Natural Resources Preservation Fund Commission," and attached it administratively to the Planning Department.



The Commission and Planning Department are charged with the task of developing an annual list of recommended priorities of lands or property entitlements to be acquired or for the funding of projects directly related to the act, and to incorporate a countywide community input process into development of this annual list.

The amendment to the County Charter, along with passage of Ordinance 812, expresses Kauai residents' desire that the island's special heritage sites and experiences will be preserved, the environment protected, and recreation and access opportunities for all of the people will be enhanced and protected for all time.
