With no further nominations, Mr. Borgatti accepted the nomination to serve as Chair for the calendar 2024, and a motion was made. Chair-elect Borgatti opened the floor for nominations for Vice Chair. Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa explained that the policy, under HRS 92-3 and the Office of Information Practices guidance, will allow the Commission reasonable administration of oral testimony in that the Chair may limit all oral testimony to 3 minutes and may grant an additional 3 minutes to provide further testimony after all interested persons have had an opportunity to provide oral testimony.	
	Chair-elect Borgatti thanked Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa for explaining what the intent of the policy is and called for a motion to adopt the policy.	A motion was made by Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa to adopt the Oral Testimony Policy. Vice Chair- elect Smith seconded the motion. Hearing no objections, the policy was adopted.
AAC 2024-2	Discussion and decision-making on adopting a revised EXCEPTIONAL TREE and PALM NOMINATION APPLICATION form. Boards and Commissions Administrator Ching mentioned that her office worked in collaboration with First Deputy County Attorney Mahealani Krafft to create a fillable form for the County's Arborist Advisory Committee webpage, making it easier for citizens to complete. Another change was necessary as they had not anticipated that an exceptional tree would be on a CPR property. Ms. Ching thanked Ms. Krafft and Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa for their assistance and guidance in getting the application form to its current form. Ms. Bryce asked what a CPR property was, to which Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa replied that CPR stands for Condominium Property Regime, where multiple tenants are involved.

	First Deputy County Attorney Krafft began by acknowledging Chair-elect Borgatti and members of the committee. She explained that the Sunshine Law had changed since the committee last met, resulting in Act 19 and requiring administrative updates. Under Act 19, the committee must provide a report during an open session when it reconvenes. The report should detail any discussions or final actions taken by the committee in the executive session. However, if disclosing the report would defeat the purpose of the executive session, the committee may maintain confidentiality. For example, if the committee convenes an executive session to discuss legal matters such as its rights, powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities with its attorney, that discussion would not be subject to disclosure in the open. Chair-elect Borgatti asked the members if they had questions for Ms. Krafft regarding Act 19 and the Sunshine Law, hearing none, Chair-elect Borgatti thanked Ms. Krafft for bringing the members up to speed.

	Mr. Paul Palmer stated his name for the record and then introduced his		
	wife, Mrs. Kathleen Palmer. They live at the Sun Village Condos in Lihue		
	behind Wilcox Hospital. Both he and his wife are members of the Sun		
	Village tree committee, and they are trying to preserve as many trees as		
	possible because every year the board changes members and they are		
	concerned that the new members may not understand the value of trees.		
	He thanked the committee for allowing them to be able to seek a		
	recommendation to designate the monkey pod tree as an exceptional		
	tree.		
	At this point, Chair-elect Borgatti opened the floor for the members to ask		
	questions.		
	Vice Chair Smith inquired whether all the board members were residents		
	of Sun Village to which the Palmers replied yes adding that the board		
	members change annually.

	Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa asked if the other owners were notified about the	
	tree nomination, to which Ms. Palmer replied yes, adding that they all	
	support the nomination.	
	Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa asked how the owners were informed.	
	Mr. Palmer explained that on February 19, 2024, he posted a notice on	
	every building within the Sun Village complex addressing the residents.	
	The notice was to inform them about the tree committee's submission of	
	an exceptional tree application to the Kaua'i County Arborist Advisory	
	Committee. The application recommended that the monkey pod tree	
	situated in the center of the Sun Village complex be designated as an	
	exceptional tree. He also mentioned that the notice was included in their	
	application packet.	
	Mrs. Palmer added that the board met with the residents living at Sun	
	Village currently, but not the residents living off the island.	
	Chair-elect Borgatti asked for clarification on whether the board ratified	
	the vote to which Mrs. Palmer replied yes.	
	Mr. Palmer referred to the letter dated February 20, 2024, signed by	
	Certified Arborist Tibor Seres (included in his application packet). He	
	stated that the letter says that Mr. Seres is the caretaker of the monkey	
	pod tree and that the monkey pod tree is "healthy and grand" and is	
	approximately 80 years old.

	Chair-elect Borgatti asked how Mr. Seres determined the age of the	
	monkey pod tree, to which Mr. Palmer replied he didn't know. Chair-elect	
	Borgatti noted that the Sun Village was built in 1980, which would make	
	the age of the monkey pod tree 54 years.	
	Mrs. Palmer noted that they did research on the history of the monkey	
	pod tree and Mr. Seres believes that the tree is 80 years old.	
	Ms. Bryce asked if Mr. Seres takes care of the tree on a regular basis or if	
	he is just the arborist, to which the Palmers replied that Mr. Seres takes	
	care of the monkeypod tree on a regular basis.	
	Mr. Palmer noted that in addition to caring for the monkey pod, Mr. Seres	
	also cares for the legacy of the other trees.	
	Chair-elect Borgatti stated that, as a certified arborist, he's happy the	
	board hired a qualified professional to care for the trees.	
	Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa asked the Palmers to explain the monkey pod tree's	
	historical and cultural value, aesthetic quality, and endemic status and	
	how it was established.	
	HOW IC THIS CAUGHIANCE.	
	Mr. Palmer stated that built in 1980, the Sun Village complex had many	
	managers who have come and gone, and over the years some of the trees	
	that were planted were taken down except for the monkey pod tree,	
	which was there before the complex was built. He stated that the Sun	
	Village Condos is home to many other beautiful trees, one is the rainbow	
	eucalyptus trees and the monkey pod tree was there the longest.	
	eucalyptus trees and the monkey pod tree was there the longest.

	Mrs. Palmer mentioned that there used to be eight rainbow eucalyptus trees on the property, but they were cut down because one of the board members heard something. Her concern is that future board members may not know the history of a tree and might decide to cut down a tree based on a mere notion.	
	Ms. Bryce inquired about any potential maintenance issues that could adversely affect the plumping of the nearby buildings. In response, Mrs. Palmer stated that she wasn't aware of any issues, but what she does know is that the arborist keeps the tree well-trimmed so that the branches are away from the buildings.	
	Chair-elect Borgatti added that looking at the pictures, it looks like beginning challenges regarding the tree roots and that the curbing has started to crack around the circle.	
	Ms. Bryce inquired whether the members of the board were concerned about it, to which Mrs. Palmer replied that she could ask the board.	
	Chair-elect Borgatti stated that as of today there is no opposition to the nomination and considering that it's the only monkey pod on the property, it is rare. Mrs. Palmer added that the tree is rare and special and if anyone were to cut down the monkey pod tree there would be a war.	
	Mr. Palmer stated that they understand there could be potential loss and issues regarding the tree's root system, but as is, things have been very good.	

	ACTION
Ms. Bryce stated that thinking ahead, should there be problems with the tree's root system where it starts to do damage and if they start to cut down those rainbow eucalyptus trees, it should be addressed because those are special trees.	
Mrs. Palmer agreed, adding that everyone who comes to the board has new ideas and being that some of the members are new they opt to cut the trees down.	
Mr. Palmer commented that having a good view and the concept of how each resident thinks it should be is challenging.	
Ms. Bryce stated that as a suggestion, perhaps, efforts should be made to help educate the community by utilizing Mr. Seres's expertise on the value and aesthetics of trees.	
Chair-elect Borgatti asked the members if they had any more questions or comments they wanted to ask or make, if not, he would like to call for a motion to recommend designating the monkey pod tree as an exceptional tree.	
First Deputy County Attorney Krafft stated that before he calls for a motion, she needs to advise the committee that they would need a written approval from the owners of the property.	
Mr. Palmer stated that the Weinberg Foundation is the owner of the property.

	Mrs. Palmer pointed out that the owner of the property is the Weinberg	
	Foundation, and Ryan Gilbert is the head of the Weinberg Foundation	
	which owns the actual land. She stated that Mr. Gilbert sent his approval	
	by email and in his email, he explained that he was out of his office and	
	wanted to send his approval by email, adding that Mr. Gilbert did not fill	
	out the notice of nomination of an exceptional tree indicating that he	
	agrees with the nomination the committee requires.	
	Mrs. Palmer stated that she is the liaison between the Weinberg	
	Foundation and the board, adding that during her conversation with	
	Mr. Gilbert told her that it wasn't a good time to start cutting down any of	
	the trees or making any decisions on what to do with the trees.	
	Mrs. Plamer also stated that they would contact Mr. Gilbert again, to ask	
	him to complete the Notice verifying that he agrees with the nomination.	
	Ms. Bryce referred to and email from Mr. Gilbert to Ms. Plamer where he	
	states that he supports what is best and the will of the residents.	
	Ms. Higuchi-Sayegusa stated that it would be good to get the approval in	
	writing and being that Mr. Gilbert is the Director of Asset Management	
	HJWF inc., she doesn't know what the direct structure is and who would	
	need to sign off. However, the ordinance does say to strive to which	
	seems to mean supportive. The big concern is if the owner objects the	
	nomination the committee wouldn't be able to make a recommendation	
	to designate the monkey pod tree as an exceptional tree.

Exceptional Tree Nomination Notice

Purpose

The Arborist Advisory Committee was created to advise the County Council in determining which trees are to be designated as Exceptional Trees. To ensure this Committee conducts its due diligence to make a recommendation to the County Council, all Nominators will be asked to obtain written accord of the owner(s) of the property on which a nominated tree is located. In lieu of written accord, at a minimum Nominators must show they provided notice to the owner(s) of the nomination.

Instructions

Provide the following Notice to all owners. Make as many copies of this Notice as necessary. Failure to provide notice to all owners will result in delays as the Committee must strive to obtain written accord of the owner(s).

Owner includes the owner listed on the County's Real Property website and each owner of a unit in a Condominium Property Regime (CPR). Nominators should consider the impact a nomination may have to the neighborhood and are strongly encouraged to provide notice of the nomination to their neighbors.

Notice of Nomination of an Exceptional Tree

I intend to propose the nomination of the tree listed on page one of this Nomination Application form as an Exceptional Tree to the Arborist Advisory Committee of the County of Kauai (the "Committee").
