F. COMMUNICATION

1. BOE 2023-15 Report on 2023 Ethics in Hawaii Conference.

Secretary Ramos-Benzel thanked the Board for the opportunity to attend the State Conference. She shared meeting counterparts from neighbor islands and assumption that Oahu has all the resources, which they do, but that Maui had none. She also shared on the handouts that were received filled with statistics and data. Kauai has two commissioners on the State Commission, Bev Tobias, who was at the conference and a retired attorney that attended virtually. Oahu has ethics training as part of onboarding as well as refreshers. She emphasized that the refresher ethics training lets people know that it's being watched and reminds employees of the code. Online trainings and videos are available to Kauai to access, highlighted the "CAN-NO CAN" video which was engaging. She felt feeling that she wanted to know more as a new member.

Member Zarbaugh added that Oahu can do so much because they have a budget and a marketing team. She agrees that if preventative action rather that reactive action was put into place. Suggest getting something in place at the beginning and refreshing for employees. The contacts that were made was great and sharing of their information is good for the board.

Secretary Ramos-Benzel added that Oahu made a strategic plan for their commission and new law on lobbyist were interesting.

Administrator Ching shared that Human Resources does a Code of Ethics training during onboarding, but she will need to check on it. She does orientation/training for new volunteers which includes the Code of Ethics. She suggested that the Board discuss under business what they would like to further look at regarding moving on issues brought up at the conference.

Member Dean Toyofuku moved to receive the report on the 2023 Ethics in Hawaii Conference, seconded by Member Kevin McGinnis.

The motion to receive the report was passed by a vote of 5:0.
