

PUBLIC HEARING

OCTOBER 23, 2024

A public hearing of the Council of the County of Kauaʻi was called to order by Mel Rapozo, Council Chair, on Wednesday, October 23, 2024, at 8:31 a.m., at the Council Chambers, 4396 Rice Street, Suite 201, Historic County Building, Līhuʻe, and the presence of the following was noted:

The Clerk read the notice of the public hearing on the following:

“Bill No. 2934 – A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. B-2024-897, AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE CAPITAL BUDGET OF THE COUNTY OF KAUAʻI, STATE OF HAWAII, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2024 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2025, BY REVISING THE AMOUNTS ESTIMATED IN THE GENERAL FUND CIP (*Kekaha Faye Park, Waimea Athletic Field, and Hanapēpē Stadium Park* – \$1,650,000.00),”

which was passed on first reading and ordered to print by the Council of the County of Kauaʻi on September 25, 2024 and published in The Garden Island newspaper on October 4, 2024.
