This Bill proposes to amend Ordinance No. B-2022-886, as amended, relating to the Operating Budget of the County of Kaua'i, State of Hawai'i, for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023, by revising the amounts estimated in the Public Access Fund by appropriating \$850,000.00 from Equity / Fund Balance — Assigned to Special Projects — Contribution to Waipā Foundation for Halulu Fishpond acquisition, to provide additional funds necessary to enable the Waipā Foundation to acquire a portion of Halulu Fishpond, which will permanently secure Waipā Foundation's ability to continue its work to foster sustainability and community through its various programs. The conveyance of a conservation easement owned by the property pertaining to the fishpond would also solidify conservation of that natural resource.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. B-2022-886, AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE OPERATING BUDGET OF THE COUNTY OF KAUA'I, STATE OF HAWAI'I, FOR THE FISCAL YEAR JULY 1, 2022 THROUGH JUNE 30, 2023, BY REVISING THE AMOUNTS ESTIMATED IN THE PUBLIC ACCESS, OPEN SPACE, NATURAL RESOURCES PRESERVATION FUND

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE COUNTY OF KAUA'I, STATE OF HAWAI'I:

SECTION 1. Findings and Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to appropriate funds for the acquisition of Halulu Fishpond and Access in Hanalei, Kaua'i, Hawai'i, further identified as TMK No. (4) 5-6-004:017. The Council finds the following:

- (a) Funding the improvements would:
 - 1. Provide public outdoor recreation and education, including access to beaches and mountains;
 - 2. Preserve historic or culturally important land areas and sites;
 - 3. Protect significant habitats or ecosystems, including buffer zones;
 - 4. Preserve forests, beaches, coastal areas, and agricultural lands;
 - 5. Protect watershed lands to preserve water quality and water supply;
 - 6. Conserve land in order to reduce erosion, floods, landslides, and runoff;
 - 7: Improve public access to, and enjoyment of, public land, and open space;
 - 8. Acquire public access to public land and open space; and
 - 9. Conserve land for open space and scenic values.
- (b) The cost and process for the acquisition is commensurate to the public interest served. In particular, assisting Waipā Foundation to secure the access to the Halulu Fishpond and acquire a portion of the fishpond would permanently secure Waipā Foundation's ability to continue its work to foster sustainability and community through its various malamā 'āina programs. Also, the conveyance of a conservation easement owned by the property pertaining to the fishpond and access would also solidify conservation of that resource.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to Sections 19.07B and 19.10A of the Charter of the County of Kaua'i, as amended, Ordinance No. B-2022-886, as amended, relating to the Operating Budget of the County of Kaua'i, State of Hawai'i, for the Fiscal Year July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023, be hereby amended as follows:

The sum of \$850,000.00 by revising the amounts estimated in the Public Access Fund from the following account:

Equity / Fund Balance - Assigned

Be and is hereby appropriated for the following purpose:

Special Projects – Contribution to Waipā Foundation for Halulu Fishpond acquisition
