

FIRST SUPPLEMENTARY EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION

By the authority vested in me as Mayor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Hawai'i and Charter and laws of the County of Kauai, in order to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the people, I, DEREK S.K. KAWAKAMI, Mayor of the County of Kauai, hereby further supplement the Proclamation of March 4, 2020, which shall remain in full force and effect, and authorize and invoke the following:

- 1. Pursuant to section 127A-13(b)(1), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, I invoke my authority to relieve hardships and inequities, or obstructions to the public health, safety, or welfare, that I find to exist in the laws of the county and to result from the operation of federal programs or measures taken under this chapter, by suspending the county laws, in whole or in part, or by alleviating the provisions of county laws on such terms and conditions as I may impose, including county licensing laws, and county laws relating to labels, grades, and standards.
- 2. Pursuant to section 127A-13(b)(2), Hawai'i Revised Statutes, I hereby suspend any county law that impedes or tends to impede or be detrimental both expeditious and efficient execution of, or to conflict with, emergency functions, including laws which by this chapter specifically are made applicable to emergency personnel.

I FURTHER DECLARE that, notwithstanding the termination of a disaster emergency relief period, any contracts, agreements, procurements, programs, or employment of personnel entered into, started amended, or continued by reason of the provisions of the proclamations relating to this emergency shall continue.

I FURTHER DECLARE that a disaster emergency relief period shall continue through May 3, 2020, or until further act by this office.
