## Ocean Safety Bureau officials advising no swimming, snorkeling for north- and westfacing shores; High Surf Advisory in effect

Ocean Safety Bureau officials advise no swimming or snorkeling at north- and west-facing shores

of Kaua'i due to a High Surf Advisory and dangerous ocean conditions.

The National Weather Service has issued a High Surf Advisory for north-facing shores of Kaua'i

and Ni'ihau through 6 a.m. Saturday.

Officials have observed surf of 12 to 20 feet. Impacts include strong breaking waves, shore

breaks, and strong rip currents that make swimming difficult and dangerous. Entering the water in these areas during the High Surf Advisory is hazardous. Beachgoers, swimmers, and surfers should use caution when entering waters.
