Cold front may bring strong southwest winds and thunderstorms late Sunday and Monday

LĪHU'E – The National Weather Service has issued a Special Weather Statement that forecasts strong southwest winds and thunderstorms Sunday and Monday.

According to the National Weather Service, a vigorous cold front could bring strong southwest winds and thunderstorms late Sunday and Monday.

"As we are in the holiday season, we are urging the public to stay informed and to take

appropriate precautions, said Kaua'i Emergency Management Agency Administrator Elton Ushio. "This

cold front could bring the potential for strong wind and thunderstorms."

As a reminder, a High Surf Warning remains in effect for north- and south-facing shores through Saturday morning. Swimming and other water activities are not recommended during hazardous ocean conditions. Homeowners, beachgoers, and boaters should prepare for the potential of significant wave run-ups along exposed north-facing shores.
