Hawai'i State DOH Kaua'i District Health Office announces 240 new cases of COVID-19 on Jan. 6

LĪHU'E – The Hawai'i State Department of Health Kaua'i District Health Office announced 240

new cases of COVID-19 on Thursday, Jan. 6.

Today's cases bring the number of active cases to 802, with seven hospitalized, and 4,968

cumulative cases. Kaua'i's cumulative case count includes 4,893 confirmed locally, eight probable, and

67 positive cases diagnosed elsewhere – which includes one of today's cases, as they received their pre-

travel test results after arriving on island.
